Early Learning

This half term in Reception we have thoroughly enjoyed learning all about Length in our maths. Tallest, shortest, biggest, smallest. The children have had lots of fun drawing around their bodies to measure the length of each other. Super fun learning with the sun out too.









In Nursery the children have explored the concept and our value of "love" as we look at Valentines Day approaching...

We have looked at books about who we love and have linked this to our feelings and emotions as we also touched upon well- being week (how we look after our bodies and minds). The children have used breathing techniques, we have spoken about ways to regulate our emotions and what we could do we when was in the red zone (angry/cross) some suggestions were going for a walk, the park, music, a hug and a drink of water.

This half term we have been learning about 'The Circus' and the diverse range of talents we all have in Love Class. Our 'Sensational Start', at the beginning of the term, was a visit from Sam the Circus Man. He gave us an amazing demonstration of his incredible talents. He then showed us how to balance peacock feathers, spin plates, juggle with brightly coloured scarves, walk the tightrope and so much more! What fun!







In D.T we have investigated, explored, designed and created circus themed hand puppets. Over the last week of term, we finished sewing our final products and evaluated them. Here are a few pictures of our wonderful creations. We have all really loved learning a new skill!







Wow, what an exciting first Spring Term Year 2 have had! In maths we have been looking at measuring. We have been using rulers and metre sticks to measure length and height and we have just moved on to interpreting pictograms.





In our English and Topic work we have been looking at Kenya and going on Safari! We have been comparing the difference between our lives and that of the children that live in Kenya







In Science we have looked at the life cycles and the forces of the push and pull. In our art work we have been creating silhouette pictures of a sunrise in Africa.





Finally, we have had a great time during our Local History Week! We have found out how St Johns has changed over the years and took a trip to the village hall to see where St Johns School use to be.





In Year 3, we have been learning all about the Romans: we have written about Gladiator battles and Roman banquets, we have made animations set in the Colosseum, we have made Roman pots and theatrical masks and we have learnt all about how the Romans lived in Rome. We thought about our harmony principle of diversity by considering how different life was for the Romans in Rome than it was for the Celts living in Britain. Life was changing - even over 2000 years ago!







The sun shone for us when we visited **Painshill Park.** We saw a Roman Mausoleum and visited the Roman-inspired Crystal Grotto. We played games to discover what life was like in the Roman Army. We then got our hands dirty making weapons and pots from clay and creating a model Roman village.























Local History Week - Deepdene Trail

We visited the Deepdene Trail and learnt about the history of the house and gardens and their change of use over time. Back in school, we wrote poems which considered the comparison between the site in its glory days and now.

This half term we have been exploring the digestive system in animals and humans. We modelled this in class using bread, water, orange juice and food colouring to mirror what happens inside the digestive system. There were many green faces around the classroom - but still wanted to see more!





Year 4 had a lovely tour around Dorking with Mr Draper, teaching us about the wonderful rich history of our town. Whilst at the war memorial, some of us were able to spot our family names and learnt about the 14 year old boy who fought in the First World War. We also looked at the importance of the Dorking Cockerel to the town. Ask any of the Year 4 class about what happened underground! Of course we couldn't resist including a picture of our wonderful Miss Ames who was also having the time of her life at pump corner.



There has a lot of trumpet blowing this half term! We've been incredibly lucky to have a wonderful trumpet teacher coming in each Tuesday to teach us how to blow our own trumpets.



Year 4 have bowled us over with their cricket skills, thanks to the wonderful John. We have been focussing on our bowling, batting skills and teamwork skills



Courage Class had a great opportunity to visit the Buddhist Temple where we were greeted by one of the Monks, who delivered an introduction about the Temple, the life of the Buddha and monastic life. Finally, children were be able to explore Buddhism faith by experiencing a short meditation and then there was time to ask any questions they had. This was a wonderful opportunity to experience and learn about the Buddhist faith and their way of life through mindfulness.







Science

Year 6 have been investigating light this term. The sun shone brightly on the day we learned about shadows - giving us an unexpected opportunity to make our explore our own shadows outside.













Topic

The Imperial War Museum provided Year 6 with a fantastic opportunity to explore the origins and reality of both World War I and World War II. They discovered the events that culminated in the 'Great War'. The children thoroughly enjoyed learning about what life was like for the soldiers on the front line as well as what life was like at home for the women and children who kept Britain running. Next term, the children will be creating their own Anderson shelters (which will be tested in a bombing raid!) and so it was great for them to experience being inside one and understand what it might have been like for people at the time.







O2 Young Voices

Children taking part in our wonderful school's choir, had the opportunity to perform in one of the world's greatest arenas alongside incredible artists and another 9,000 children at the Young Voices 2024. This was a Wonderful achievement that helped to grow children's self-belief, self-motivation, confidence, and ability to communicate as part of a team - which is invaluable! Add to this the numerous health benefits of singing in rehearsals, including breathing exercises to focus the mind - it's no wonder that Young Voices is the event of the year for our young choir! The concert is the culmination of a lot of hard work from the children and the teachers who support them throughout the year. We sang our hearts out and cannot wait for next year's Young Voice already!










First Steps to Understanding my Child (ADHD, Autism and Neurodivergent) Course


