
Our unique and ambitious curriculum at St John's is underpinned by our values of Love, Trust, Respect, Cooperation, Resilience and Courage.




TEACHING & LEARNING



Children will be motivated and empowered to learn, critically think about the world around them and apply their understanding effectively; these will be the children who shine

Children will have a wealth of transferable skills which have been developed throughout their time at our school in an inclusive and nurturing environment. We want the children to see that our curriculum can teach us how to live more sustainably





Children leave St John's with the ability to be resilient learners who have respect for the world around them. Ultimately, we want children to be socially, morally, spiritually and culturally responsible and aware; to make positive contributions to be global citizens.



As a school, we aim to develop mathematicians of the future, where maths is enjoyed by all, challenges are accepted and solved, where mistakes are recognised as part of the learning journey and where a deep and rich mastery understanding of maths is an opportunity for all.

Teaching Mastery is a transformational approach to maths teaching. When taught to master maths, children develop their mathematical fluency without resorting to rote learning and are able to solve non-routine maths problems without having to memorise procedures. Simply, maths lives within them.

Children are provided with two maths books each year, which are sequenced to build on prior learning. Teachers are trained to deliver a style of 'mastery maths' through the Maths No Problem approach.



ENGLISH

At St John's we have adopted "The Write Stuff" by Jane Considine to bring a whole school approach to the mechanics of writing. We use "Sentence Stacking" to engage children with short, intensive moments of learning that they can then immediately apply to their own writing. Each writing lesson is based on a sentence model, broken into three chunks:

- 1. **Initiate section** a stimulus to capture the children's imagination and set up a sentence.
- 2. **Model section** the teacher close models a sentence that outlines clear writing features and techniques.
- 3. **Enable section** the children write their sentence, following the model.

Children are challenged to 'Deepen the Moment' which requires them to draw upon previously learnt skills and apply them to their writing during that chunk.







Children begin their reading journey at
St John's through the rigorous Read Write Inc
Phonics programme. They receive daily
phonics sessions from Reception and are
regularly assessed and grouped. To support
learning to read, we provide children with
decodable reading books which are matched
to our phonics programme and the
grapheme-phoneme correspondences the
children are learning. Children gain a
cumulative progression in phonics knowledge.

RECEPTION AND EARLY YEARS

At St John's we aim to deliver an outstanding Early Years curriculum, twinned with our Harmony curriculum and the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS).

Children make swift progress within a child centred context, and make a smooth transition to Key Stage 1. They flourish in their social, emotional and physical development, along with developing an excitement and love for learning and challenge.

OUR NURSERY

Here at St John's, we offer a flexible Nursery environment. There is the option for 30 hours funded childcare for those that are entitled.

In Nursery we work from the Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum. The children develop through playing and exploring, active learning and creating and thinking critically.

The children are immersed in lots of practical experiences through which they are encouraged to explore and experiment. The children use both the indoor and outdoor classrooms during teacher directed and child-initiated times.

INCLUSION AND SEND

Positive relationships between adults and pupils mean that pupils learn in a calm environment. Pupils who need extra help to manage their behaviour are supported extremely well.

Like all local schools, we have a strong emphasis in supporting all students, and accommodating those with additional needs.

We are proud of our inclusive, nurturing ethos. We are committed to all children achieving their full potential and believe this is gained through outstanding teaching, high expectations of behaviour and an environment where they feel happy, safe, valued and respected.

Our Inclusion Lead works with class teachers and parents to identify, at the earliest opportunity, children who may need additional support. We then decide on appropriate support options, strategies and interventions. We regularly review the provision we put in place to ensure we are supporting children to make the best possible progress in their learning.



Through quality first teaching strategies, many SEND needs are met and supported naturally in class. Alongside this, where identified, we provide support through Nurture, Play Therapy, ELSA, Soft Starts and the use of Intervention Teachers.
